Notes:

The *tehtar* (vowel signs) are placed over the *tengwar* (consonant signs) which precede them.

𐌔 used as an s-curl in English, when written under a *tengwa* denotes a final h-sound or breath added to a syllable, but is primarily used to distinguish **Θ** (na) from **G** (nah).

Example: **G** = Nah = 𐌗

Θ = Na = 𐌕

As with Korean Hangeul, this mode for writing Cherokee arranges all of the characters composing a syllable into one block, so that this could best be defined as a phonetic syllabary. Blocks are grouped together into words separated by spaces.

Punctuation:

The symbol : which looks like a colon, is used as a colon and a semi-colon.

The symbol · is used as a comma.

The combination of the two symbols :· is used as a period.

Other punctuation may be borrowed from English or other languages.
