WHAT IS O.C.L.E.A.?

The Oklahoma Campus Law Enforcement Association (OCLEA) was founded in 1970 by a small group of concerned campus law enforcement professionals who saw a need for the bringing together of their counterparts to address the problems of campus law enforcement. The goals they established to meet this end are:

1. To promote the common interest in the administration, operation and development of Campus Law Enforcement, Police, Security and Public Safety Departments in the State of Oklahoma.
2. To foster improved methods and procedures in the administration, planning, development, operation and maintenance of law enforcement, police, security and public safety departments.
3. To promote professional ideals and standards to better serve the educational objectives of all institutions.
4. To schedule, plan and conduct statewide meetings of the association for the discussion of matters of common concern and to enhance the professional knowledge of its members.

WHO CAN JOIN?

O.C.L.E.A. has 60 member institutions from all parts of the state. These institutions encompass secondary, vocational and higher learning institutions.

The Oklahoma campus Law Enforcement Association is open to all persons involved in campus law enforcement at the public or private secondary level, Vo-Techs and all institutions of higher learning. Several different types of membership are available:

1. Institutional Member: Any institution of secondary, vocational or higher learning which offers a certificate of completion, diploma or degree and which provides law enforcement, police, security, or public safety services shall be eligible for active membership.
2. Associate Member: - Law Enforcement, Police, Security, and Public Safety personnel employed by, or contracting services to member institutions, instructors in Police or Criminal Justice at institutions of secondary, vocational and higher learning, and administrators of such institutions may be voted to Associate Memberships. Persons who are engaged in Law enforcement, security, police or public safety functions but not affiliated with a member institution may also be elected to Associate Membership.
3. Honorary Member – Persons who have worked

diligently for the success of the Association and who have retired from their position with a member Institution may be elected to Honorary Membership.

4. Supporting Member – A Person who by reason of vocation, profession, or business interests shares in the concerns and objectives of the Association and desires to demonstrate such support by membership may, upon approval of the membership committee, be recognized as a Supporting Member.

WHAT HAS O.C.L.E.A. ACCOMPLISHED?

O.C.L.E.A. has been instrumental in promoting legislation important to Vo-Techs, Public and Private School Systems and institutions of higher education. Some of these legislative accomplishments are:

Joint Services Agreement – Permits educational institutions to enter into agreements with local law enforcement agencies to provide law enforcement services within the institution's boundaries and to allow campus law enforcement to assist local agencies.

Permitting public, private school districts and institutions of higher education to establish security or law enforcement functions on their campuses and to define the differences between security, police and public safety officers.

Permitting the dual commissioning of law enforcement officers so they may also perform security or police functions on campuses outside their normal jurisdictions.

Legislation in progress:

Expanding Title 21, section 1835 relating to trespassing and permitting colleges and universities to prohibit trespassing on college or university public or private property.

Establishing a means for colleges and universities to dispose of found and/or confiscated property.

Barring the possession of certain weapons on the campuses of institutions of higher education.

Provided guidance and direction to member institutions in helping them comply with the federal, "Student Right to Know and Campus Security Act" to ensure strict compliance with all aspects of the law.

OCLEA also has strong ties to the International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators (IACLEA) with several members occupying regional or administrative positions.

In addition, several members serve on the "Law Enforcement Legislative FORUM". This forum comprised of representatives from law enforcement agencies and organizations across the state, meets monthly while the legislature is in session. Its goal is to work with lawmakers in writing and soliciting their support for legislation important to law enforcement activities.

OCLEA also has a representative on the Oklahoma Council for Law Enforcement Education and Training.

HOW OFTEN AND WHERE DOES O.C.L.E.A. MEET?

Meetings are held every other month on the campus of one of the member institutions. A short business meeting is conducted followed by a program dealing with a subject of interest to the members. The meeting concludes with a "round table" during which all institutions discuss events of common concern, their solutions to problems encountered and new and innovative ideas that enhance the idea of effective campus law enforcement. The meetings end by 3:00pm.
