The Political Science-Public Administration major requires 36 hours of course work. At least 18 hours of advanced (3000 & 4000 level) courses are required in the political science major. At least eighteen hours of this major must be earned at NSU. A second major or minor may not be earned in Political Science. This degree is offered on both the Tahlequah and Broken Arrow campuses. At Broken Arrow this major requires that four courses be taken through Tulsa Community College (TCC) on the BA campus (see separate Degree Program Overview for NSU-BA).
